





A contemporary take on the savage classic “Lord of the Flies” as a group of mismatched, modern day teenagers must fight to survive on a deserted island.


When an incriminating video of two teens having sex is uploaded onto social media, it starts a sequence of events that lead to tragic consequences. A compelling and thought provoking read.



T


Twister is battling her Dad’s disappearance, Mum’s mental illness and serious bullying at school. The action necessitates her to be both resilient and true to herself.


Dan and Alex are forced to spend the summer cooperating together in the building of a raft, despite the fact that Dan has been bullying Alex because of his OCD.




Resilience and bullying on a remote Scottish island in the 18th Century. Carnegie winner 2018.


Carey is wrongly accused of bullying her best friend online and must prove her innocence.

T


A tense, twisty thriller in which a girl's disappearance spirals into a snare of manipulation and lies. Shortlisted for the Hampshire Book Award 2018.

T+


Jealousy and competition bedevil Jade and Beck's friendship after an ex boyfriend says that Jade was his second choice anyway. An examination of friendship and loyalty.

T



T



T




A look at what happens when we spend too much time online- low self-esteem and exposure.
